





As much as color dominates his drawings and paintings, it's the line that I am most intrigued by. Bayuzick will use a straight geometric line to pierce the organic space so as to separate one area from another. In a couple of works, a right angle was used to contain an area so that it is seen as a "space within a space" or in order to cut a painting's surface in half. Bayuzick's sculpture is another matter. The ability to choose and pair together found parts to create a larger whole is a different skill set altogether from that of the painter.

Born in 1943 in Pittsburgh PA, **Ron Bayuzick** grew up in a very artistic environment. Much of the artistic influence can be attributed to his parents because of their weekly trips to the Carnegie Museum art classes, and by studying music in school. With an undergraduate degree in Arts Education from Edinboro University and a Master of Fine Arts from Kent State, Bayuzick was well prepared for the true meaning of a working artist. Once he completed his formal education, Bayuzick spent 30 years working as an art teacher at Stow High School in Ohio. Even today, Ron continues the pursuit of educating children in the arts, participating in community public art projects and contemplating every opportunity presented to him.






Heather Hertel Professor of Art SRU of Pennsylvania

Heather is working on a large project with Slippery Rock University Art Majors: my first floating art exhibition: 6 – 8 J22 sailboats displaying painted sail designs. Thursday, August 14, 2025 from 6-8pm

A note for folks who would like to watch from the 3rd parking lot at Presque Isle: bring binoculars, as the Erie Yacht Club is ¾ mile across the bay at this point.

SRU faculty and students collaborate to create large-scale paintings on recycled J22 sails, each consisting of a mainsail and a jib integrated into one moving composition. The J22 sailboats adorned with painted sails will cruise as a floating art exhibition on Presque Isle Bay, Erie, PA hosted by the Erie Yacht Club. The saiboats will be sailed by the Women on the Water (WOW) sailing program. The SRU faculty/student team will learn the mechanics of sailing, idea generation, designing, projection, painting on sailcloth, photo and video documentation, the ability to connect with people and experience their visions afloat.


The Arty Party takes place
