Byler's stoneware, earthenware and porcelain pieces are inspired by nature, and, in many cases, are meant to become a part of it. His pieces, entitled 'Garden Picks' are sculptures that are designed to sit atop copper poles, planted in the garden, or in bases that sit on interior or exterior hard surfaces. They are the kind of decorative element that will enhance a garden by becoming a focal feature and complementary part of it, or a stand alone sculptural statement.

Dan Byler earned his master's degree in studio ceramics from Edinboro University and has been creating works in clay for more than fifty years. The tops of his pieces have floral or geometric forms; those same motifs recur in his collection of lidded jars, and are enhanced with elements like the fishtail on the top and the scale design on the side of a piece. The palette in which Byler works is rich and organic, the forms and adornment give the vessels a vintage appearance, allowing each piece to speak for itself.


