Association needs your help!

The Northwestern Pennsylvania Artists Association (NPAA) is a nonprofit 501c(3) organization for professional artists. Our mission is to create opportunities for established, emerging and student artists through exhibitions, education, and scholarships. The NPAA was founded to ensure professional artists could band together to help each other, promote the visual arts, and protect artist endeavors. This has driven us for nearly 50 years and after all this time, we still stand as the only organization in the region to offer this.

That need is not changing, young artists still need help, which means the NPAA needs your help. Over the past 22 years, we have successfully awarded over \$95,000 in scholarships to high school seniors to help them offset the rising costs of higher education and pursue careers in the visual arts and help allow their talent to be recognized and shared. However, the cost of higher education is continually on the rise and art students typically don't have the same scholarship opportunities that are available to their peers who participate in athletics for example. That said, the need for NPAA scholarships is growing.

This year, the NPAA has created an endowment fund with the sole purpose of continuing these scholarships to allow young artists to thrive in the region. This endowment will provide us greater financial stability to continue to provide the scholarships and allow us to increase the value of them. Our goal is to raise \$75,000 this year, with growth reaching \$100,000 by 2025. This endowment relies on contributions from our community members that share our passions and mission.

To date, we have raised over \$36,000 through these contributions. To continue on the path of meeting our year end goal of \$75,000, we need the support of community members such as yourself. We will have a webpage set up to allow for direct donations on our website at npaaonline.org or by mailing checks to NPAA, P.O. Box 6156, Erie, PA 16512.

This endowment will allow us to continue to offer these scholarships and encourage young artists to grow and thrive in the region. Please consider donating to our endowment campaign and helping passionate young artists thrive.

It's fundraising, one pint at a time!

In the upcoming **Know the Place** show running August 23-December 2, 2023, **PennWest Edinboro University's Bruce Gallery** will present almost fifty works addressing time and place. Inspired by the famous phrase from T.S. Eliot's Four Quartets - "We shall not cease from exploration. And the end of all our exploring will be to arrive where we started and know the place for the first time" this show will include two, three and four dimensional artworks of real and invented landscapes, built environments and local histories.

Works drawn from the gallery's permanent collection include Jacques Callot's 1619 architectural elevation; Christo's 1968 plan to wrap Chicago's Museum of Contemporary Art; Han Hsiang-Ning's 1980 print, N.Y. Skyline; and Piranesi's 1749 Imaginary Prisons.

Loaned works include John Baker's sketches for Buffalo. NY murals: Benton Bainbridge's (and Sariah Storm's) "science project" illustrating changing seasons via two trees flanking a mountain; Collin Bonner's documentation of his skateboarding in northwestern Pennsylvania; Larry Brown's photographs of Erie's historic commercial property; small-scale, hollow-constructed, copper-sheet architectural forms by Morgan Calabrese; plein air oil-stick drawings by Alaskan artist John Jodwalis; architect Jeff Kidder's adaptive reuse plan commissioned by CIVITAS for the Edinboro Boiler House; paintings of New Jersey houses by Steve Lewis; sculptor Heather Molecke's fictional display of Cleveland history; Jon Rubin's film HereThere, that visually connects interiors of homes lining a Pittsburgh street; Christopher Schneider's Astroturf sculptures of U.S.A. street signs; and an installation of postcards by anonymous residents of West Texas and New Mexico organized by Leslie C. Sotomayor II (and Katy Ballard) responding to a variety of prompts including, "belonging, crossroads, fear, home and happiness."


